Tara Holcomb - Community Accountability: It Begins With You



Tara will introduce you to the dynamics of community-based responses to domestic and sexual violence — in other words, community accountability. We will discuss how our criminal justice, medical, and educational systems have traditionally responded to marginalized survivors of violence, especially those who are Deaf, Hard of Hearing, DeafBlind, and Deaf Disabled. We will learn about other possibilities of safety, support, and healing for survivors who experience violence. Together, we will explore how we can create safer and healthier Deaf communities by supporting survivors and holding each other accountable.

Tara has worked at DeafHope in Oakland, California since 2011 and currently serves as Empowerment Director. She has taken over 100 hours of training in domestic and sexual violence to be certified as an advocate in the state of California. She has been involved with anti-oppression and anti-violence work in Deaf communities for more than ten years. During her time with DeafHope, she has been exploring community-based responses to domestic and sexual violence. She lives in the bay area with her partner, Chad and their three children: Pax, Thoreau, and Clementine.
